Sunriver Anglers Annual Fish Fry:

Saturday, July 17 is the day for the Anglers Club's annual "Fish Fry" at Fort Rock Park. The event starts at 11a.m. and runs to 2 p.m. The term "Fish Fry" is the traditional title of this long standing community event, but the mouth-watering rainbow trout are actually grilled on the barbecue, not 'fried". Regardless of the terminology, though, attendees always marvel at the quality of the meal served up by the members of the club.

All persons in the area are invited to attend what is always a very enjoyable event. Tickets are priced at \$12 for adults and \$6 for children under 12 years of age. Tickets can be purchased from club members or at the event. Hamburgers and hot dogs are also available for the non fish eaters in the crowd.

This will be the 13th annual Fish Fry. As in the past, there will be silent auction items and fly fishing demonstrations according to club president Alan Stout. Local businesses have donated products and services including fishing gear, boat rentals on popular fishing areas, Sunriver lodging, rounds of golf and other interesting items.

Proceeds from the Fish Fry are used by the Anglers Club for conservation and youth activities. Since the inception of the event, more than \$100,000 has been raised for Anglers supported projects, such as the Kokanee Karnival educational program which reaches over 1,000 youngsters in Central Oregon. The Club entertains and educates over 200 children at their annual Free Fishing Day with exhibits, aquatic displays and a great opportunity for kids to go fishing with their parents and grandparents. The Club also sponsors an annual graduate scholarship program at Oregon State University and is a major contributor to the activities of the Deschutes River Conservancy, the organization which is spearheading the efforts to return normal flows to the Deschutes River.

Three Creek Lake Outing July 13:

July's first outing is scheduled for Tuesday, July 13, at Three Creek Lake which is located in the Deschutes National Forest south of Sisters. Three Creek Lake is a high mountain lake that sits at an elevation of about 6,500 feet. The area receives a lot of snow so the date of this outing could change depending on snow and road conditions. Three Creek Lake offers good fishing for both rainbow and brook trout.

Where and When to Meet

This outing will be a day trip, but you can make it a campout on your own if you want to do so. For the day trip we will meet at the **Sunriver Marketplace** (north market on Cottonwood Road) **parking lot at 7:00 a.m.** and caravan or carpool to the lake.

Bring your own lunch and beverages because we'll probably be on the lake and fishing most of the day.

Directions to Three Creek Lake:

To get to the lake drive to the City of Sisters and turn left on Elm Street. Continue on this road, which turns into Road 16, for about 17 miles to the lake. The road forks at the lake. Take the left fork which will bring you to the boat launch.

Camping: There are several campgrounds next to the road that leads to the lake. Additional campgrounds are at the end of each road fork. All of the campgrounds are operated on a first come first served basis.

Information and Fishing Tips

Three Creek Lake is about 28 acres in size and is ideal for small boats and pontoon boats. There are rowboats for rent at the resort if you don't have a boat. Gas powered motors are not allowed on the lake.

The mosquitoes can be numerous and fierce so make sure you bring your insect repellent.

Three Creek Lake is another lake that few if any of us have fished. Bill Merrill, who was President of the Sunriver Anglers in 1991, now lives in Sisters and often fishes Three Creek Lake. If we're fortunate, Bill might even be able to join us on the outing. Bill has provided us with a map of fishing areas on the lake and the following information about fishing the lake. Copies of the map and other fishing information will be provided to you at the outing.

Much of the fishing is done by trolling, but you can cast and retrieve flies or fish dry flies if a hatch occurs. Fish with an intermediate sink or floating line if you're trolling or casting and retrieving. You can fish as you do at most lakes by trolling a wooly bugger. Bill recommends trolling or casting and slowly retrieving a small Sheep Creek Special trailed by a Griffith's Gnat. Standard nymphs such as a gold ribbed hare's ear, pheasant tail, or Prince will also work well. Another fly that works well at Three Creek Lake is the pollywog.

Dry flies work well if you see a hatch or an ant fall. Good flies include a dark Adams, Timberline emerger, and a black or cinnamon ant.

Fish along the weed beds and ^{drop} offs by trolling or casting and slowly retrieving your flies or lures. Fish can also be caught by trolling in the deeper water in the center of the lake. The maximum depth of Three Creek Lake is about 60 feet.

In addition, Little Three Creek Lake, which is located about a half mile by trail from the Driftwood Campground at Three Creek Lake, is reported to provide good fishing for brook trout. This is a smaller, shallower lake that is probably best fished from a float tube or from the bank.

Help Wanted For Chub Trapping and Removal:

Your help is needed with the tui chub trapping and removal efforts at both East and Lava lakes.

EAST LAKE

Jen Luke, from the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife has asked for our help from July 13 through July 16 at East Lake. The following is a message Jen sent asking for our assistance. Those of you who signed up earlier to help with this project should have already received this message.

"Hello anglers/ volunteers-

We would like help from volunteers on **July 13-16** to empty chub trap nets. Just let me know what day you would like to help out.

I know many of you want to help but have other things planned - please don't feel guilty if you can't help out this year! We will trap chub for the next 3 years so there will be ample opportunity to get involved. Also, for those of you with bad backs, beware- there will be a lot of bending, lifting 5 gallon buckets and fish scooping.

Finally - Please let me know where you would like to meet the morning of your shift... I will let the ODFW person know where to meet you. If you want to contact them to confirm or change plans, that's ok. E-mails and phone numbers are on the spread sheet.

LAVA LAKE

We have also received a request to help with chub removal at Lava Lake. The owners of Lava Lake Resort have been trapping chub at Lava Lake on their own for many years and have managed to keep the chub under control. Lava Lake is one of best in this area's for quality rainbow trout fishing because of these chub control efforts. The resort's owners have asked both the Sunriver Anglers and the Central Oregon Flyfishers for some assistance in seining chub from the lake this year.

Juvenile chub congregate in shallow water on warm, sunny days and this is the best time to catch them by seining. Seining involves dragging a beach seine net in shallow water where chub are present and

pulling the net onto the shore. You will need to wear chest waders because you will be walking in waist deep water. At least two people will be needed to drag and haul the seine and to take care of the fish. Seining of chub at this site should not take very long and can be done whenever two volunteers are available. You can probably combine a fishing trip to Lava Lake or one of the other nearby lakes with a chub seining effort on the same day. You will need to contact someone at Lava Lake Resort 541-382-9443 to get the seine and other necessary equipment.

Crane Prairie Outing—July 20 & 21:

Please notice that this July outing has been moved from East Lake to Crane Prairie Lake because the USFS is decommissioning the East Lake Group Camp site that we have traditionally used for the East Lake overnight outing. Another suitable group site is not available in the East/Paulina lakes area, so we have decided to move the July 20 and 21 outing to Crane Prairie. It has been fishing very well this year, and is producing a good number of nice size fish. Going to Crane will also afford us the opportunity for some instruction on chironomid fishing, which some members might not be familiar with.

We will be based out of the Rock Creek campground on the west side of Crane Prairie, which is easily accessible off highway #46. It is available only on a first come first serve basis, but is almost never very busy so there should be plenty of spaces. If enough campers sign up, we will have a potluck dinner Tuesday night, July 20. Everyone will be responsible for their own entre, and Mal Murphy will provide salad and bread. Lunch both days will be on your own, as people will probably be spread out over the entire reservoir.

East Lake Outing, August 3:

Donner Und Blitzen River Outing, August 10—12:

On August 10, 11 and 12 Doug will also lead an outing to the Donner Und Blitzen River, in Harney County south of the Malheur National Wildlife Refuge. Camp sites are available at the Paige Springs Recreation Site. Walking will be required to access the best areas of the river. This outing also affords the opportunity to combine some excellent fishing on a beautiful desert country river with touring the spectacular Steens Mountain area. It is about a 3 hour drive from Sunriver, heading east on Hwy 20 to Burns, and then south on Hwy 205. Contact Doug at Doug@Vakoc.com or 541-598-2048 if interested.
