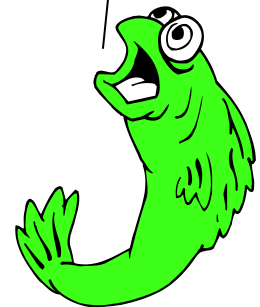

Kokanee Carnival

Whew! The Fall Streamside is complete for another year. We had some challenges with the bus schedules but all the volunteers pulled together and revised the program on the run giving all the students an exciting education program. We had 14 classes, four at Spring Creek and 10 at Sheep Bridge/Fall River hatchery. The groups at Spring Creek saw lots of Kokanee including some males fighting for a female. The students really liked getting into waders and working in the stream. A real hands on experiences and no one fell in. At Sheep Bridge the students saw bald eagles, osprey, pelicans and lots and lots of fish. Some even saw an osprey catch a Kokanee. This was the first year in a long time we were at Sheep Bridge and teachers and students really liked it, so did the volunteers. The students at the Fall River hatchery saw some huge trout close up and got to touch them. They learned a lot about the Oregon hatchery program. Our volunteers were from Central Oregon Flyfishers, Oregon Fish and Wildlife, Sunriver Anglers, US Fish and Wildlife and Wolfree. We had 11 new volunteers this year.
