Most members qualify for this position. All you need is a computer and know how to turn it on and off. You also need some kind of software that will help you compose the newsletter. This newsletter is being typed into Microsoft Publisher, a very easy way to publish monthly newsletters. If you have this software you are a prime candidate for this prestigious position. If you are fortunate enough to be awarded this position, and you don't have the software, there is a very good chance the club will purchase the software for you so you can accomplish the job. Pete will also walk you through the program as many times as necessary.

Although you may think it is a hard job to get the newsletter out each month, it really isn't. Once you have the software into your computer and know how to use it, all you have to do is to wait until somebody sends you something to put in the letter. By simply "copying" (not retyping) what they send you, you then "paste" it into the next newsletter. There is some fiddling you need to do with dates, issues, headings etc., but it is very easy. Once you learn the software you probably won't spend more than 2-3 hours a month for each newsletter—and those hours are spread out over the month.
