Recreation and Outings

The Fishing Front

This month we're in the quiet time of the year on the fishing front. The cold weather and snow have certainly reduced our fishing opportunities locally, but there are still some places for the hardy angler to fish. The Crooked and Fall rivers, Ochoco Creek, Metolius downstream from Allingham Bridge, and Deschutes River downstream from Benham Falls are open all year and can provide good angling.

Streamflow in the Crooked River is low so take care when catching and releasing fish. Be careful of overhanging snowbanks when you're fishing the Fall River. You don't want to tumble into the stream in this cold weather. Lakes in this area, with a few exceptions, are also open to fishing all year although most of them are probably frozen over or inaccessible.

Winter steelhead fishing should be in full swing for those who are willing to drive a little further. Some of the closer streams with winter steelhead runs include the Rogue, Umpqua, and Santiam systems, and the Sandy, Hood, and Clackamas Rivers. You could also journey to the coast and fish any of the many rivers in that area for fresh run steelhead.

Fishing Regulation Changes

Several changes in fishing regulations took effect at the beginning of 2016. These may affect how, when and where you fish during the coming year. Here is a brief summary of the major regulation changes for nearby Central Oregon waters.

Most lakes will be open all year with a few exceptions. The exceptions include Lake Billy Chinook, Crane Prairie Reservoir, and Wickiup Reservoir which will still have opening and closing dates for fishing. This change to a year round open season will allow you to fish lakes such as East, Paulina and Big Lava earlier or later in the year than the old regulations permitted.

The daily limit of trout at the Crooked River has been reduced from 5 fish to 2 fish and use of bait is no longer legal. This change should result in fewer fish caught and kept during the summer, but could allow for more fish kept in the winter. Previously, the Crooked River was restricted to catch and release fishing during the winter. Ending the use of bait should reduce the mortality of fish that are caught and released.

The entire length of Fall River is open all year. This change allows fishing downstream of the falls throughout the year.

Angling at Hosmer Lake is now catch and release for all species.

January Meeting - UNDERSTANDING THE MOVING WATERS OF FALL RIVER



The Thursday, January 21, 2016 meeting of the Sunriver Anglers will feature Marc Williamson, a long-time fly fisher who maintains a vacation home in Central Oregon and frequently fishes the nearby lakes and rivers. Among his standard presentations are reading and fishing moving waters and fly fishing on the Fall River, topics which he will combine for the Sunriver Anglers.

In his former life, Marc was an educator, ending that career as a Professor of Education at Warner Pacific College in Portland. However, he continues his passion for teaching and learning with fly fishing, which he began many years ago when his father gave him his first fly rod outfit. "I find teaching fly fishing, fly casting and fly tying a great

opportunity to give back, and share my passion, and what I have learned. I love to see people get excited about learning.

It is exciting to see people tie their first fly, cast their first cast or catch their first fish.” He is a certified guide and instructor, teaches at fly fishing schools and frequently presents at fly fishing clubs and shows throughout the Northwest. During the summer, he co-instructs a fly fishing school at Clydehurst Lodge in Montana.

The Fall River is known as a difficult river to fish. It is clear, cold and spring fed, but there are fish to be found by the educated angler. Marc will show us how to read the Fall River waters to understand where the fish are and then how to present flies to entice a strike.

The January 21 meeting will be held at the SHARC facility in Sunriver. Both Anglers and non-members, male and female, are welcome to attend. The formal meeting begins at 7 pm, but many folks arrive early, around 6:45 pm to swap fish stories.

February Meeting - Sunriver Anglers Club host a Tie and Pie Night

Come to the Thursday, February 18, Sunriver Anglers Club Meeting and learn how to tie a fly and have a slice of delicious pie. Meeting begins at 6:45 PM at the SHARC, 57250 Overlook Road in Sunriver. Both club members and non-members, male and female, are welcome to attend.

Fly-Tying Corner

Chromie Buzzer Chironomid



The early season features very limited bug activity. About the only active insects are midges, commonly known as Chironomids. In the mid-day sun these insects are active and a mild weather day can even bring some surface activity. But, for the most part, it is a subsurface game this time of year. In the past few weeks I have been tying up a variety of Chironomid patterns. One of the patterns I have been tying is the Chromie Buzzer. This fly imitates the midge subsurface as it is preparing to ascend to the surface and hatch. .

I recently bought some Alec Jackson Crystal Chironomid hooks. They are a curved hook and are a good option. But any curved hook, like a scud hook or similar will suffice. I look for a wide gape and very sharp point, which translates to better hooking qualities. I used a glass bead on this pattern, which will help the fly sink slowly. I will use glass beads and in deeper water tungsten beads. I have also been using a UV quick cure resin recently on almost all of my Chironomid patterns. It makes the fly realistic and very durable. Take a look at the picture at the and you will see the translucence in this pattern.

Chromie Buzzer Chironomid:

Hook: Curved Daiichi Alec Jackson Crystal Chironomid hook in sizes 11-13, Daiichi 1260 or similar in sizes 12-16, or any scud hook like a Tiemco 2457 in sizes 12-18.

Bead: Clear Glass Seed Bead, sized to match hook size. Also try slate, silver and gold colored beads, or glass beads in various colors like red, amber, gunmetal, etc.

Thread: Black, 70 Denier

Abdomen: Mirage Tinsel - Large

Ribbing: Fine wire in red

Thorax: Clear Glass Seed Bead surrounded by thread wraps

Wing Pads: White Goose Biots, partially colored with an orange Sharpie

Over Body: Clear cure UV resin, such as Clear Cure Goo.


