

Starting at 6 pm, Fred Foisset of The Hook Fly Shop will be teaching a "Cast Better and Farther with Fred" class prior to our regular meeting. He will also give a brief presentation about releasing fish safely before Gary Lewis begins his talk.

Sunriver Anglers Club welcomes a well-known and informative outdoorsman and writer, Gary Lewis, to its general meeting on July 21, 2016 at 7:00 pm at the SHARC.

Most of you have read Gary Lewis' columns in the Bend Bulletin, in numerous magazine articles or in one of his 15 fishing and hunting books, or watched the TV show Frontier Unlimited that he hosts. Currently he is publishing the 6th edition of *Fishing Central Oregon and Beyond*, which is a must-have guidebook for any angler who fishes in our area. This newest edition will be at the July meeting so you can acquire the most up to date information about our waters.

Many of Lewis's books have won Northwest Outdoor Writers Association (NOWA) Excellence in Crafts awards and he has received numerous awards for his newspaper columns and magazine articles. Lewis has been past President of NOWA and was recently awarded the prestigious Enos Bradner Award. Some of his book titles include: *Fishing Mt. Hood Country*, *Oregon Lake Maps and Fishing Guide*, *Freshwater Fishing Oregon and Washington*, and *Trout Fishing in the Pacific Northwest*.

Gary Lewis lives in Central Oregon with his wife and three camo-clad daughters. Some of his newspaper columns are engaging descriptions of teaching and fishing with his children and other youth. This can be an inspiration to readers to get their children or other youth engaged in the great sport of fishing. The future protection and support of wildlife and fishing activities will depend on our youngest fishers and hunters.

Gary Lewis was born and raised in the Pacific Northwest and has been exploring, running rivers, and fishing here from his youth. He is also well-traveled and has hunted and fished in seven countries and across the United States. If you want to find out about fishing in the Pacific Northwest or other destinations, ask Gary Lewis, he may have been there.

His presentation will include a discussion of fishing in our lakes from his perspective. He will explain how to read lakes quickly, what to look for, and how to start prospecting for trout right away. He will inform us of the three best lakes for bass and the six best lakes for large trout.

He will also explain the eight rules for catching large trout and how to set up an ambush to catch a fish displaying a regular feeding pattern. The program will encourage the audience to think in different ways and participate with their own insights. This will be an informative and stimulating program so be sure to attend. You are welcome to come early at 6:30 pm to socialize before the program begins at 7:00 pm.

Pyramid Lake – Want to go fishing for Lahaton cutthroats in Nevada's Pyramid Lake? Chris Wharton, owner of Stillwater Guide Service, and the Sunriver Anglers are proposing a trip to Pyramid Lake in the *first two weeks of November 2016*. *If you are interested, e-mail Rynie at ryniesra@gmail.com*

Cost - \$115 per angler per day for Chris as our guide.

Travel time to Sparks – 6 hours and 38 minutes, 392.3 miles via US 97 and CA 139S.


Pyramid Lake is the third largest lake in Nevada and is a true natural wonder located in the Pyramid Lake Paiute Indian Reservation in western Nevada. Covering 117,400 acres, it is the third largest of the remaining salt lakes in the United States, after Great Salt Lake in Utah and Salton Sea in California. The lake is fed by the Truckee River, the outflow of Lake Tahoe. It has

no outlet with water leaving the lake only through evaporation in this high desert environment.



This hostile, but beautiful area is home to the Lahaton cutthroats, the largest native growing trout in North America. Chris has had many clients land cutthroats over the 20lb. mark. As he puts it, it isn't rocket science to catch fish at Pyramid. But there are many little intricacies, that when followed, will up the number of large fish caught.

Sunriver Anglers Fly-Tying Corner

Balanced Cinnamon Leech

Sometimes you have to try different approaches to catch fish. One of my often successful alternatives during warm summer days, when the fish move to deeper waters, is to suspend a balanced leech under an indicator. A regular leech pattern hangs in a lifeless looking manner. But the unique nature of a balanced leech makes the fly look more lifelike and results in more takes. Leeches are a very sizeable portion of a trout's diet throughout most of the season.

They present themselves in an undulating swimming motion near weedbeds and other subsurface locations, often pausing this motion for extended periods.



Opportunistic trout prey willingly on this food source. An angler can easily imitate this undulating motion by taking short strips of a balanced leech pattern under an indicator, with pauses in between strips. Stopping the movement periodically is often when a trout takes. Experiment with depth and speed variation in your retrieve to find out what the trout want on a particular day. If the wind is creating nice ripples on the water, the up and down motion from the indicator also creates a perfect swimming motion. Leeches account for some of the larger fish I land each year!

Balanced Cinnamon Leech - Materials List:

- Hook:** Mustad 32833BLN Jig Hook, Size 10 or similar
- Thread:** Tobacco Brown, 70 Denier
- Tail:** Marabou in Dark Brown or Rust and
UV Krystal Flash Fibers in Root Beer or Peacock
- Body:** Euroseal Dubbing Blend of Dark Olive, Brown, Rust and Canadian
Leech (25% of Each)
- Head:** Size 7/64 or 1/8 Bead Placed on a Straight Pin

Experiment with this pattern when the fish demand you work a little deeper during warm summer days. It is an excellent pattern to fish over structure, such as on the "Hump" at East Lake. Try different color variations and sizes with this pattern. Olive, tan, brown and black all produce fish.
